



## BLUE-GREEN ALGAL BLOOM WEEKLY UPDATE

REPORTING OCT. 6 - OCT. 12, 2023


Satellite imagery provided by NOAA - Images are impacted by cloud cover.

A value of 0.004 is nominally equivalent to approximately 20-30 ug/L chlorophyll a of cyanobacteria, and 0.06 would be in the 300-500 ug/L chlorophyll a range. Please keep in mind that bloom potential is subject to change due to rapidly changing environmental conditions or satellite inconsistencies (i.e., wind, rain, temperature or stage).





Satellite imagery for Lake Okeechobee is partially obscured by cloud cover but shows low bloom potential on approximately 5% of the lake, primarily in the southwestern quadrant.



Satellite imagery for the St. Lucie **Estuary shows no visible bloom** potential.



Satellite imagery for the St. Johns River shows scattered low bloom potential on Lake George and an area of low bloom potential on the mainstem of the river between **Deep Creek and Colee Cove.** 

## **SUMMARY**

There were 25 reported site visits in the past seven days with 25 samples collected. Algal bloom conditions were observed by samplers at one of the sites.

On 10/9-10/12, Florida Department of Environmental Protection staff collected 17 harmful algal bloom (HAB) response samples. The Tiger Lake - Center sample was dominated by Microcystis wesenbergii and had trace level (0.14 parts per billion [ppb]) microcystins detected. The **South Fork New River** - **Rio Nuevo A Condo** sample was co-dominated by *Microcystis aeruginosa* and *Chlamydomonas* sp. and had no cyanotoxins detected.

There was no dominant algal taxon and no cyanotoxins detected in samples from Hancock Creek - Moody Ramp; Able Canal - Connie Ave N; and 11 samples from the Caloosahatchee River (West First St. and Altamont Ave; N of Loftons Island; Coral Point Dr; End of Coon Rd; Overiver Dr; Whitecap Cir Dock; End of Canal Cir; SE 32nd St; Jaycee Park; Horton Park; and McGregor Colonial Park).

Results are pending for Georges Lake - Boat Ramp and Doctors Lake - Doctors Lake Park.

On 10/9-10/11, St. Johns River Water Management District staff collected one HAB response and seven HAB routine samples. The St. Johns River - Shands Bridge; Doctors Lake - Center; St. Johns River - Mandarin Point; Lake George - Center; and M-canal just north of Blue Cypress Lake samples had no dominant algal taxon and no cyanotoxins detected. The Stick Marsh - North and Blue Cypress Lake - Center samples were dominated by Microcystis geruginosg and had no cyanotoxins detected. The Crescent Lake - Mouth of Dunns Creek sample was codominated by Microcystis aeruginosa and Cylindrospermopsis raciborskii and had no cyanotoxins detected.



This is a high-level summary of the sampling events for the reported week. For all field visit and analytical result details, please refer to the complete algal bloom map with data table by clicking the "Field and Lab Details" Quick Link from the Algal Bloom Dashboard. Different types of blue-green algal bloom species can look different and have different impacts. However, regardless of species, many types of blue-green algae can produce toxins that can make you or your pets sick if swallowed or possibly cause skin and/or eye irritation due to contact. We advise staying out of water where algae is visibly present as specks or mats or where water is discolored pea-green, blue-green or brownish-red. Additionally, pets or livestock should not come into contact with algal bloom-impacted water or with algal bloom material or fish on the shoreline.

## We have big news to share!


The Indian River Land Trust recently acquired a new conservation property, adding 33 additional acres of protected green space. The property is located on the South Prong of the St. Sebastian River, along the southwestern border of the City of Sebastian.

In keeping with the Land Trust's recently adopted Strategic Plan and newly expanded reach across Indian River County, this is the first property protected by the Land Trust off the Indian River Lagoon. The St. Sebastian River is home to manatee, alligator, the prehistoric garfish, important bird rookeries, and species of globally rare fish. It is the only natural tributary of the Lagoon in the county, which underscores its conservation value to the Land Trust.

The property contains an Old Florida cypress forest that stood long before the cities of Sebastian and Vero Beach were incorporated. A portion of the property was formerly a citrus grove, but now contains 22 acres of native oak trees and cabbage palms that have replaced the orange trees. The remaining 11 acres encompass the mature cypress trees with 1,600 feet of river frontage.

While not currently open to the public, the Land Trust hopes that this property will be the spark to realize a long-imagined greenway trail. Plans have recently resumed for a scenic nature trail along the river between Route 510 and Route 512, an area designated by the County as the St. Sebastian River Greenway. The effort to obtain this designation was originally spearheaded by the Land Trust in 2006. Working together with other local non-profits and municipal leaders, the Land Trust hopes that this vision will be realized in the foreseeable future.

### This acquisition puts IRLT's new Strategic Plan into action!



The Land Trust has developed a new strategic plan that will guide our work through 2028. The acquisition of the Sebastian River property officially puts this plan into action, by expanding our reach out to the four corners of Indian River County.

The strategic plan outlines our new mission, vision, guiding principles, and strategic goals to continue our critical work of protecting and preserving the natural world around us.




